## **HOME CARE PACKAGE PROVIDER STOCKTAKE - JUNE 2021**

## **Definitions**

Number of recipients receiving services	The total number of care recipients at each level who received the relevant care/service type in June 2021.
Total hours of service delivered to care recipients	The total hours of care/service delivered to care recipients at each level in June 2021 for the relevant care/service. This is not applicable to some service types (e.g. home modifications).
Total dollars charged to care recipients	The total amount charged to care recipients' Home Care Packages at each level for the relevant care/service in June 2021.
Personal Care	Personal care services may include help with: bathing; showering; toileting; dressing/undressing; getting in and out of bed; washing and drying hair; shaving; and reminding care recipients to take their medication.
Nursing - registered nurse	Nursing services delivered by a registered nurse.  Nursing services may include: wound care and management; medication administration such as assisting care recipients to take medication; general health and other assessments; certain medical tests including blood pressure; and support with dementia.
Nursing - enrolled nurse or other	Nursing services delivered by an enrolled nurse or
licensed nurse	other licensed nurse.
Cleaning & Household Tasks	Cleaning and household tasks may include: help with making beds; ironing; laundry; dusting; vacuuming; and mopping.
Light gardening	Light gardening may include help with light weeding; watering; light pruning; lawn mowing; or minor garden maintenance.
	This category does not include the cost of major external modifications to the home.
In-home respite	A care worker supporting a care recipient in their home for a short period of time, for example when their carer is away or unavailable.
Standard hours	Standard hours as defined by the provider in the Home Care Agreement and Care Plan. The hours may vary between providers.
Non-standard hours	Care delivered outside of standard hours (such as on a weekend or overnight).

Care management	Care management may include: reviewing the Home Care Agreement and Care Plan; coordination and scheduling of services; ensuring care is aligned with other supports; providing a point-of-contact for care recipients or their support network; ensuring the care received is respectful of the care recipient's culture; and identifying and addressing risks to care recipient safety.
Self-managed	Where care management is managed by the care recipient.
Managed by provider	Where the provider is fully responsible for care management.
Package management	Package management is the ongoing administration and organisational activities associated with ensuring the smooth delivery and management of a care recipient's Home Care Package. It may include the costs for: preparing monthly statements; managing package funds; and compliance and quality assurance activities required for Home Care Packages.
Staff travel to visit care recipients	Staff travel is the cost for a care worker to travel to visit the care recipient's location. This is <b>not</b> the amount charged for care workers to travel with care recipients, e.g. for shopping or to attend medical appointments.
Subcontractor costs	The additional amount charged for any services delivered to care recipients by subcontractors. Note that this is only the <u>additional</u> cost (such as a handling or brokerage fee), and <u>not</u> the cost charged by the subcontractor for the service.
Home maintenance	Home maintenance reasonably required to maintain the home in a condition of functional safety and provide an adequate level of security.
Home modifications - total	Modifications to the home, such as easy access taps, shower hoses or bath rails.
Consumables - total	Items such as bandages, dressings, and continence aids.
Capital items - total	Includes items such as mobility aids and equipment, or assistive technology.
Social support, shopping services, community access (including transport)	Transport and support for shopping or to attend medical appointments or social/community activities.
Meal preparation	Includes assistance with preparing meals, using eating utensils and eating aids, and assistance with actual feeding.

Miscellaneous	Any other amounts charged to the Home Care Package which are not covered by the above categories.
Basic Daily Fee	Fee paid to providers that adds to the funding available in the care recipient's Home Care Package. The Government sets the maximum amount a provider can charge, which varies depending on the HCP level.
Income tested fee	Fee paid by some care recipients as determined through an income assessment.
Fees for 'top-up' services	Any other amounts paid for additional care and services (as agreed between the care recipient and the provider) that were not covered by the care recipient's Home Care Package budget.
